### Wellcome Trust Funding

We are very happy to announce the success of our application to the Wellcome Trust Functional Genomics Development Initiative (FGDI) for Biomedical resources, collections and databases. This is in conjunction with the [Mouse Genomic Nomenclature Committee](#) (MGNC), and the three year funding will support the development of resources in two key areas:

Human and Mouse Orthologous Annotation (HUMOT) - Co-ordinating the naming of genes from the human and mouse transcriptome projects to reduce confusion by ensuring that the same genes in both organisms are given the same gene symbol.

Human Gene Ontology Annotation (HUGOA) - Assigning standard terms to describe the biological processes, molecular functions and cellular components (Gene Ontology) to human gene products during the nomenclature process.

We will soon be advertising for positions in these areas, so watch this space.

### Olfactory Receptors

Following continuing refinements to the human genome sequence data we have been asked to approve a further 92 new olfactory receptor (OR) symbols. However, along with these updates, approximately 100 OR gene records will need to be merged to remove duplicates. This will result in 980 approved OR symbols. We would very much like to thank Janet Young ([Fred Hutchinson Cancer Research Center](#)) and Tsviya Olender ([The Human Olfactory Receptor Data Exploratorium](#)) for their assistance with this.
