Meetings Attended

Matt represented the HGNC at the [29th FEBS Congress](#) (26 June - 1 July 2004) in Warsaw, Poland where he was asked to give an oral presentation of his poster Family Matters - Naming Genes Within Families.

Matt gave an invited talk on Keratin and KAP gene nomenclature at the Gordon Research Conference on Intermediate Filaments (8-13 August 2004) at Queens College, Oxford, UK. During the discussion session that followed, it was decided to set up a keratin nomenclature committee, which is to be chaired by Mike Rogers. The committee will generate nomenclature proposals which will then be voted on by the general keratin research community.
